Select Diversity Courses at Cornell University
Fall 2006 and Spring 2007

At Cornell you will have many opportunities to explore multiple dimensions of diversity. The Tapestry of Possibilities presentation is a wonderful introduction to these issues. Later, you will engage diversity through your residential and social activities. We hope that you will also engage diversity through your courses. Although Cornell does not have a university-wide diversity course requirement, we do encourage you to take courses that engage unfamiliar issues of race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, class, and religion.

One reason Cornell does not have a diversity requirement is that we cannot know which courses will stretch your perspectives on diversity. The appropriate mix of courses will vary depending on your characteristics, your experiences, and your intellectual biography. During the next four years you have a wonderful opportunity to move out of your comfort zone, to stretch yourself intellectually and socially. We encourage you to embrace diversity rather than to just tolerate the range of difference that you will encounter at Cornell. In many instances you will develop new perspectives. In other instances, you will confirm your own ideas, analyses, and interpretations. A Cornell education of freedom with responsibility places you in a unique position to enhance your creativity and intellectual depth. The skills to see things in different ways, to make new discoveries, and to become leaders come from engagement with different perspectives.
