

West Campus House Fellow Position Responsibilities

Title: **House Fellow**

House Fellows work with the House Professor/Dean, Assistant Dean of the House and Graduate Resident Fellows in providing intellectual and social opportunities for student-faculty-staff interaction in the House. House Fellows are responsible to the House Professor/Dean.

Responsibilities:

- 1) Build House community by interacting informally and formally with students in groups and as individuals on a weekly basis.
- 2) Contribute to the intellectual and social life of the House.
- 3) Work closely with the House Professor/Dean, Assistant Dean, Graduate Resident Fellows and student residents, in establishing the House program in consultation with the House Council, the student run governance structure, and the House Council Program Committee.
- 4) Create opportunities for informal learning and artistic experiences in the House such as programs, activities, informal offerings, lectures, screenings, workshops, arts events, discussion groups, and non-credit in House courses.
- 5) Engage other unaffiliated university faculty and senior administrators in social, artistic and intellectual programming and opportunities to be with students in the House.
- 6) Meet regularly with House Professor/Dean.

Term of Appointment:

The West Campus House Council will appoint House Fellows to three-year terms with the possibility of renewal upon review.

Conditions of Appointment:

All members of the Cornell faculty and senior members of the university administration are eligible to serve as House Fellows.

During the academic year House Fellows are expected to take meals on a regular basis in the House for the course of their appointment.

Support Funding

Each House Fellow will receive a 1) West Campus parking permit 2) free access to West Campus community facilities 3) Meal Plan/Big Red Bucks privileges at CU Dining units during the academic year.
